Help protect Pennsylvania's waterways by learning how to monitor for two very destructive aquatic invasive species – zebra and quagga mussels. No prior experience is needed - just an interest in protecting our local waterways. All materials including a DVD training video and monitoring manual will be provided.

***Zebra and quagga mussels*** can cause great harm to the economy, aquatic ecosystems, and native clam and mussel populations. Pennsylvania Sea Grant and the Philadelphia Water Department have been helping to monitor for new infestations and to alert boaters to take precautions to reduce the risk of transporting the zebras to new locations.

As of now, only a few of Pennsylvania's 12,000 lakes and 84,000 miles of streams are infested with invasive mussels. The Pennsylvania Zebra and Quagga Monitoring Network is sponsored by the DuPont Clear into the Future program, the Pennsylvania DEP, the Philadelphia Water Department, Pennsylvania Sea Grant with a host of partners, to help slow the spread of invasive mussels in the Commonwealth's rivers, streams and lakes. Monitors of *all ages* are needed so that water users may be alerted to take proper prevention measures.
